The show airs on Tuesdays at 9 pm in San Francisco, on 91.7 FM KALW, on other major city stations, and as a podcast on iTunes, PRX and indeepradio.com

She is also a regular host and moderator of public events and discussions, appearing over the years with the "Commonwealth Club" and "City Arts and Lectures." Her work as a voiceover talent includes corporate demos, narrations and commercial work.

Coiro has conducted interviews with Anna Quindlen, Peggy Orenstein, Will Durst, Mary Roach, Salman Rushdie, Bernie Sanders, Barney Frank, Gail Sheehy, Cleve Jones, Charlie Jane Anders, Martin Short and others. She won the coveted Radio News Director Award for Best Interview with Salman Rushdie. Quindlen, the best–selling author of "Millers Valley" and "Still Life with Breadcrumbs," told the Commonwealth Club that "Angie's interview was the most insightful and interesting of her book tour and one of the best she had ever had in decades of being interviewed."
