Virginia Woolf wrote essays, short stories, and novels, most of which were published by Hogarth Press. That includes all her most famous books: "To the Lighthouse," "Mrs. Dalloway," "Orlando," and "A Room of Her Own."

What you may not know is that Virginia and her husband, Leonard, founded Hogarth Press themselves in 1917 to hand-print books.

Not only did they publish Virginia's writing, but also, among other authors, the English translations of the complete works of Sigmund Freud.

No wonder Virginia's stream-of-consciousness stories were influenced by psychoanalytic theories. She was their publisher!
